

CHEMOTHERAPY REGIMEN IN THE HOME - It Takes a Village

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Background

- Historically, chemotherapy infusions were limited to inpatient or hospital-based infusion centers. However, with the growing incidence of cancer, strain is put on resources, availability of beds or infusion chairs, and patient accessibility to a hospital or clinic. Fairview Home Infusion (FHI) provides a new option for patients to improve treatment experience, lower cost and increased convenience.
- □ Following the COVID-19 pandemic, there has been a great shift in health care transition to the home. With appropriate assessment of patients, treatment protocols, and specialized nursing, the implementation of home care services has become a practical option for providing ongoing chemotherapy treatments.
- With 30+ years of experience, over 3000+ patients, and 23 Ambulatory Infusion chairs , FHI offers a plethora of medications from IV antibiotics, to TPN, IVIG and more. However, the administration of chemotherapy in the home started in 2020 with a few medications such as bortezomib (Velcade), decitabine (Dacogen) and azacitidine (Vidaza).
- Currently, the Oncology (Red) team provides 33 approved treatments and more than 15 Certified Oncology Nurses to over 300 patients in the home.
